Description

- Tapestry depicting a verdant scene enlivened by a wading bird, woven in the 18th century from an Aubusson workshop. - This tapestry, a Verdure (Greenery), presents a lush landscape with a majestic tree rising to the full height of the tapestry. Its luxuriant, vibrant foliage is adorned with red flowers/fruits, adding vivid touches that are very pleasing to the eye. This landscape is enhanced by a body of water in the foreground, which a wading bird seems to have chosen as its hunting ground. The verdant scene is enlivened by another bird higher up, in full flight. - This tapestry is distinguished by the freshness of its colors, particularly the green and red tones, and by its silk weave. Weave fineness: approximately 5 threads/cm. - Some wear is present (see photos). Unlined, without hanging hardware. -
