Each base features a sculpted Romanesque capital, adorned with stylized motifs and resting on twin columns characteristic of Romanesque architecture. The stone's patina, softened by time, bears witness to centuries of history and lends the piece a remarkable sculptural presence. The modern glass top highlights the beauty of the antique elements while adding lightness and functionality. This juxtaposition of antiquity and modernity creates a unique piece of furniture,
