### Description

An impressive large Wedgwood lustre bowl from the early Fairyland period designed by Daisy Makeig-Jones circa 1915. The exterior is decorated with an unusual marbled lustre ground blending rose, ochre, green and violet iridescent tones, forming a richly layered shimmering surface. Two long-bodied Eastern dragons in finely engraved matte gold encircle the bowl, framed by a refined Gothic-style gilt border at the rim.

The interior displays warm orange lustre with purplish-red spatter mottling and a fine underglaze crackle network, characteristic of early lustre techniques. Around the sides appear delicate gilt Chinese scholar's objects including musical instruments, scrolls, vessels and stands, with a richly ornamented central medallion
