18-karat gold and 925 silver brooch set with nine old-cut diamonds and seven rose-cut diamonds, depicting a crescent moon. Fastens with a pin and folding hook. Eagle's head hallmark: 750 gold. Illegible maker's mark. Estimated total diamond weight: 0,75 cts. Total weight: 8.63 g. An antique system allows this brooch to be transformed into a hair ornament. Presented in a burgundy leather case with tooled decoration, monogrammed M.E, from the Gemilini house, 11 rue Crébillon, Nantes. Good condition. Note: The moon, a symbol of femininity, was the attribute of the Greek goddess Artemis, twin sister of Apollo, or Diana to the Romans. She is the goddess of the moon, nature, the hunt, and the springs of life. Carefully packaged, shipped with declared value and insurance.
