Description

Authentic Japanese samurai 32-plate iron kabuto dating to the Edo period (17th-19th century). The helmet is constructed in the traditional suji-bachi style, formed from thirty-two riveted iron plates with pronounced ridges radiating from the crown. It features an ornate tehen-kanamono at the top, a projecting mabizashi (visor) with mount for a crest (maedate), and large fukigaeshi side guards covered in decorated leather. The kabuto retains its five-lame lacquered iron shikoro (neck guard) with original silk lacing. The iron bowl shows a rich aged patina consistent with period manufacture. The interior of the helmet bears a maker's signature, indicating workshop production by a traditional armourer. A classic and very displayable example of a traditional
