He was a student of François Dubois (1790-1871). His first participation in the Salon dates from 1843 and he participated until his death in 1869. He exhibited a very large majority of portraits and some still lifes. Between 1850 and 1860, he also practiced the art of pastel.The model depicted is Madame Louise Yvert, née Geslin (Troyes, 1835 - Saint-Étienne-du-Vauvray, 1918), wife of Édouard Yvert (Versailles, 1822 - Saint-Étienne-du-Vauvray, 1892). The marriage took place in Troyes on June 26, 1854. Édouard

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Yvert made a substantial donation to the Institut de France on December 2, 1881 to found the annual Jean-Jacques Berger Prize (named after the former prefect of the Seine and friend of Édouard Yvert) which is a prize "awarded by its five Academies to the most deserving works of the city of Paris". The prize still exists.
