Monumental 17th-century fireplace plaque belonging to the Barons of Raviile. The Raviile family (von Rollingen in German) was an old Luxembourgish noble family who owned a castle in the village of Raviile (Moselle). Formerly a Luxembourgish enclave, the village of Raviile was ceded to France by the convention of May 16, 1769. [Wikipedia] The family died out at the beginning of the 18th century. Coat of arms: 1st and 4th, gules, three silver chevrons, representing Raviile; 2nd and 3rd, gules, a silver cross anchored. Thanks to Philippe Palasi, author of "Heraldic Fireplace Plaques," for identifying the coat of arms. Width 107 cm, Height 87 cm, Thickness 5 cm, Weight between 160 and 200 kg
