In 1734, he restored the independence of the Kingdom of Naples after the period of Austrian rule, marking a significant milestone in the kingdom's history. The miniature is executed with finesse, in keeping with the tradition of 18th-century Italian court portraits. The face is delicately modeled, and the details of the costume and ornaments are rendered with precision, demonstrating meticulous craftsmanship and a beautiful balance of colors. The work can be compared to that of the 18th-century Neapolitan school, known for its
