Maison Lecan presents this solid oak farmhouse bench from the 1950s, a piece of remarkable formal purity that perfectly illustrates the aesthetic of French modernist rural furniture--that pivotal period when peasant tradition and contemporary simplicity converged in objects that were simple, robust, and beautiful. The generously sized, one-piece solid oak top reveals warm, undulating grain with a beautiful depth, patinated by decades of use. Its slightly irregular edges attest to handcrafting, faithful to the wood in its most vibrant form. The base, made of straight, rectangular uprights connected by a lower stretcher, displays an architectural simplicity reminiscent of the formal vocabulary of Chapo or Perriand--this way of letting the wood speak for itself, without embellishment or
