A set of three porcelain bottles and stoppers made by Samson in the famille rose style of the East India Company. Square base with canted corners; white glaze, embellished with bouquets of flowers, a band decorated with faux glazed tiles in shades of pink framing the bouquet cartouches on the upper four sides. A gold rim delineates the edges and the various decorations. Produced by the Emile Samson workshop (1837-1913), famous for its reproductions of antique Asian porcelain. The three pieces are marked on the reverse with a red stamp in the Chinese style, concealing an 'S'. Dimensions: Heights: 15 cm - 13 cm - 11 cm; Width: 9.30 cm - 8.20 cm - 6.70 cm; Depth: 7 cm - 6 cm - 5.30 cm. Second half of the 19th century.
