The body is engraved with a finely executed PB monogram, adding a personal and refined touch to the piece. The turned ebony handle provides a striking contrast with the brightness of the silver and highlights the quality of craftsmanship. The decoration remains restrained and well composed, featuring a fluted spout and a delicate beaded border along the lid--details characteristic of refined silversmith work from the early 19th century. Hallmarks: Vieillard hallmark (950 silver standard) Maker's mark in a lozenge, « ED » The presence of the Vieillard hallmark, used between 1819 and 1838 before the introduction of the

Minerva mark, allows for a precise dating to the first third of the 19th century. Condition: Good overall condition. Visible signs of use, including a slight dent. Rather than detracting from the piece, these marks serve as a reminder that such high-quality silverware was intended for daily use. They lend the object a sense of life and quiet emotional presence. Gallery's note: An elegant and intimate object, typical of personal silverware from the early 19th century.
