

The piece rests on an elegant polylobed base, adorned with finely punched circular decorations. The slender stem is embellished with a central knot, ensuring a harmonious and balanced grip. The openwork chapel, intended to house the relic, is surmounted by an architectural roof, itself crowned by a representation of Christ on the cross, emphasizing the spiritual and symbolic dimension of the
