Description

A rare and authentic Alpine-style cabinet, dated 1776, featuring a remarkable two-part design typical of late 18th-century Swiss craftsmanship. This piece is distinguished by its balanced composition: a lower, enclosed section with two doors and drawers, surmounted by a stepped section punctuated by three elegantly carved arches, a true hallmark of regional Swiss workshops. The recessed upper section also opens with two doors featuring molded panels and shaped panels, still bearing the hallmarks of the late Baroque style. The whole is crowned by a wide, projecting cornice, lending the piece a strong and structured architectural presence. Made of solid wood (likely walnut or fruitwood), it displays a warm, aged patina, nuanced by time, revealing the full authenticity of its handcrafted

construction. The understated and well-proportioned antique hardware contributes to its refined rustic character. This type of furniture, originating from the Swiss Alps (Bern, Fribourg, or surrounding areas), was intended for the homes of the wealthy bourgeoisie or rural families, where it served both as storage and as a centerpiece in the living room. Rare on the market, this piece is appealing due to its precise date (1776), its typically Alpine structure, and its very good state of preservation. A distinctive piece, at the crossroads of folk furniture and high-quality regional pieces, it is ideal for authentic décor or a collector's home.
