Description

An elegant pair of painted tinsplate vases, baluster-shaped and resting on pedestals, decorated with architectural landscapes in the antique style. The painted reserves depict ruins, columns, follies, and small figures in a neoclassical style very characteristic of the late Empire or Restoration period. Each vase is embellished with applied lion heads holding movable rings, a decorative detail particularly appreciated in the decorative arts of the first half of the 19th century. The pair is appealing for the delicacy of its painted decoration, the warmth of its amber-brown hue, and its elegant silhouette.
