Krishna's Dance with the Gopis (Rasa Lila) Oil on cotton, 85 × 115 cm mounted on a frame. This painting depicts the sacred scene of the Rasa Lila, a famous episode from Hindu tradition recounted in the Bhagavata Purana. In the center appears the god Krishna, recognizable by his bluish skin and ornate crown. He dances and leads a group of gopis, young, devout shepherdesses, who surround him in a joyful circle. The scene takes place at night, under a full moon, in a lush garden filled with flowers and trees. The dancers, dressed in richly decorated saris, perform graceful gestures evoking music and devotion. In the foreground appears a lotus-adorned pool, a symbol of purity and spiritual elevation.
