A rare collection of six silver-plated teapots elegantly illustrating the evolution of forms and tastes throughout the 19th century, from the sobriety of the First Empire to the freer lines of the fin de siècle. This set displays a beautiful stylistic diversity: Empire-inspired models with clean, architectural lines resting on claw feet; balanced and harmonious neoclassical pieces with elegantly curved profiles; and Rococo examples with dynamic decoration and more generous silhouettes, characteristic of the Romantic taste of the 19th century. Some teapots retain their blackened wooden handles, demonstrating a concern for both function and aesthetics, while others display discreet or more pronounced
