The clock movement, of French origin and signed "Vincent - Silver Medal 1885," is in perfect working order and complete with its bell and pendulum. The globe displays the time in 24-hour format, with gold Roman numerals for day and black numerals for night--an ingenious device that enhances both its functionality and its
