A fine French porcelain covered trembleuse chocolate cup and saucer from the Manufacture de la Reine, rue Thiroux, dating to the late 18th century circa 1780-1800. Founded by André Leboeuf in 1776, the factory received the protection of Queen Marie-Antoinette in 1778 and adopted the red crowned A mark, which appears on both pieces. The set is of refined covered trembleuse form with a deep saucer designed to hold the cup securely. The cup has a tapering body, loop handle and domed cover with a berry finial and leaf. The decoration combines pink and lilac ribbon trellis panels, blue floral sprigs and gilt borders on a white ground. The saucer features a geometric ribbon design giving a neoclassical balance.
