Elegant rug in "Kork" wool and silk, Isfahan design, Extra Fine quality. Circa 1980. These rugs are hand-knotted in India, following the style of Persian rugs. Hence their name, Indo-Isfahan. The oriental motifs of the rugs include medallions or repeating patterns, as well as representations of the Tree of Life. The rugs are exquisitely crafted, and the silk gives them a delicate and lightweight feel, with a beautiful sheen. The use of silk also allows for the creation of incredibly fine designs, and one cannot help but be impressed by the work involved in making a rug. These magnificent silk rugs offer a smooth and soft texture with a natural beauty and luster. On a midnight blue background appear polychrome floral medallions in the shape of star-shaped diamonds, surrounded by petals and flower buds. A ruby-red main border with

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interlacing, flowing branches, itself framed by seven multicolored floral counter-borders.
