Adrien Étienne Gaudez, born in Lyon on February 9, 1845, and died in Neuilly-sur-Seine on January 23, 1902, was a French sculptor. Gaudez studied under François Jouffroy at the École des Beaux-Arts in Paris in 1862. He made his debut at the Salon two years later. A prisoner of war in Magdeburg during the Franco-Prussian War of 1870, he is notably responsible for the monument to the memory of the French prisoners in that city. He is also the author of Florian. from Alès, the war

The bronze statue and cartouche at the top were melted down under the Vichy regime in 1942, as part of the mobilization of non-ferrous metals. Clermont-Ferrand, Roger-Quilliot Art Museum: Actaeon, circa 1898, bronze. Neuilly-sur-Seine: Hebe, statue; Monument to Parmentier, 1888, melted down under the Vichy regime in 1942, as part of the mobilization of non-ferrous metals. The statue was replaced in 1982 by an identical replica by the sculptor Andre Lavaysse, made from a bronze reduction kept at the town hall; Monument to Jean-Rodolphe Perronet, 1897, the statue was sent to be melted down under the Vichy regime, as part of the mobilization of non-ferrous metals. In 1981, the municipality replaced it at another location (Île de Puteaux) with an 18th-century stone statue of unknown origin.
