The mat's construction reflects the industrial spirit of interwar Belgium, when factories and training halls relied on durable and authentic materials. The thick-gauge, tightly stitched leather was designed to withstand repeated impacts and constant handling. Its tactile surface, softened by decades of use, retains the authenticity and

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character that collectors of vintage sporting goods and industrial design so value. The integrated leather handle adds both practicality and charm, highlighting the mat's original function while enhancing its sculptural presence today.
