suji bachi kabuto 62 blade with rivets so fukurin in shakudo gold engraved around the ashi base ,the fukigaeshi and the mabisachi metal maedate representing the ken ,sword that cut ignorance and protects associated with fudomiyo as the red flames Fudo Miyo is an esoteric Buddhist deity (Mikkyo, Shingon / Tendai) the protector of practitioners an incarnation of Dainichi Nyorai in his wrathful form

His name means:

"The Immutable"

And for a samurai, that's huge. Fudo:

holds a sword: cuts through ignorance
