suji bachi kabuto 62 blade with rivets so fukurin in shakudo gold engraved around the ashi base ,the fukigaeshi and the mabisachi the wide shikoro is hon kozane which denotes the high rank of the samourai metal maedate representing the ken ,sword that cut ignorance and protects associated with fudomiyo as the red flames Fudo Miyo is an esoteric Buddhist deity (Mikkyo, Shingon / Tendai)the protector of practitioner is an incarnation of Dainichi Nyorai in his wrathful form His name means:"The Immutable"Fudo:holds a sword: cuts through ignoranceholds a rope: binds negative forcesis surrounded by flames: purifies with fireFor a samurai:killing is not glorifiedbut seen as a karmic necessitymabisachi and fugkigaeshi covered with leather .a mon representing
