making long stops at cabinetmakers Languedoc
cabinetmakers, where they left their mark. As for
peasant furniture was, by contrast, quite sober,

became simpler as you moved from East to West.
The sideboard appeared in almost all interiors,
alongside the wardrobe and chest. doors pivoted
on large plugs and were decorated only with
mouldings. The carved motifs were concentrated
on the bottom rail."
