Description

Elegant horn-shaped vase on pedestal, made in France during the Belle Époque period (circa 1900), in the ornamental repertoire of the Louis XVI style. The body is made of deep burgundy-red glazed ceramic, known as "Sang-de-Boeuf". In low-angled light, the glaze offers remarkable depth and brilliance. The object is enhanced by a large, finely chased gilded metal frame. The neck has a wide frieze of facing griffins and antique-style vases. The handles are decorated with busts of winged women, palmettes and interlacing patterns. The base has a four-legged base with claw feet and acanthus leaves. Technical details: Original central threaded rod assembly with hexagonal nut under the base. Nice used condition with its original patina with some traces of oxidation on the metal and wear to the gilding.
