Jallanchouze" top right oil on wood panel 23.8 x 17.9 cm Framed: 37.5 x 32 cm This portrait of a friend of the artist reveals a real sensitivity on his part, and the dedication reveals the closeness and complicity that may have existed between the artist and his model. As he poses for the painter, we can see just how concentrated this young man is, and at the same time, a real vitality shines through under the artist's brushstrokes. Although the painter produced a few portraits, he is best known for his landscapes and genre scenes, painting his models in an intimate style, no doubt for a more restricted circle, demonstrating a real talent for this genre. Georges Ferré was a painter of genre scenes and landscapes. He studied in
