JAPAN - Edo period (1603 - 1868).SHAKUHACHI, bamboo flute with five holes, it consists of two elements whose interlocking is encircled by a black lacquered metal disk, two lines of the bamboo rhizome adorn the end of the flute.Cracks.Length: 55 cm.Diameter: from 3.5 to 6 cm.Notes : The shakuhachi flute is a traditional Japanese musical instrument, always made of bamboo. It is played by blowing into a beveled mouthpiece, which produces a sound that is soft, deep and highly expressive. Originally used by Zen monks for meditation, the shakuhachi is distinguished by its ability to imitate the sounds of nature, such as wind and water. Today, it is used in both traditional music and contemporary compositions.
