### Description

Solid silver traveling ciborium. A plain model, it rests on a circular pedestal, the interior is vermeiled. The lid ends in a thick cross-shaped socket. Weight :81gr.Punch marks on the foot, the rim of the bowl and the lid.Punch mark : Minerve, 1st title (950/1000).Smith : Maurice POUSSIELGUE.Period : from 1861 to 1933.Specialized in religious objects. His father's works are listed in the Louvre, Musée d'Orsay, Musée des Arts Décoratifs de Paris...Manufacture of goldsmith's and bronzes for churches, Paris. Managed from 1849 to 1889 by Placide Poussielgue-Rusand (1829-1889). At his death, the company became Poussielgue-Rusand Fils and was run by his son Maurice Poussielgue-Rusand (1861-1933), then his grandson Jean-Marie Poussielgue-Rusand
