Important ritual mask from Nepal, made of polychrome papier-mâché, depicting a demonic head crowned with Citipati figures. The main face, with expressive, powerful features, features bulging eyes, an open mouth revealing accentuated dentition and a protruding tongue, typical of Himalayan protective iconography. The forehead is adorned with a stylized third eye, reinforcing the object's symbolic and spiritual dimension. The upper part is decorated with a crown of small skeletal figures, identifiable as Citipati, tantric figures associated with the macabre dance and impermanence in Vajrayana Buddhism. Their presence lends the mask a strong ritual and apotropaic charge. Vivid polychrome, predominantly red, with green, ochre and black highlights. Beautiful patina. Visible wear, chips
