The finely figured rectangular mahogany top, with gently rounded corners, is framed by a broad rosewood cross banding and embellished with decorative brass star inlays and brass stringing to the edge. A refined apron with ebony stringing further accentuates the elegance of the design. The top is raised on a striking quattro form pedestal base centred by a finely turned column. The fluted platform, enriched with intricate ebony marquetry, flows into four gracefully hipped and scrolled legs, each inlaid with ebony and terminating in the original decorative brass
