Adam-François Van der Meulen 1632/1690: baptized January 11, 1632 in Brussels and died October 15, 1690 in Paris, was a Flemish Baroque painter of Brussels origin. In 1646, he studied in Brussels with Peeter Snayers, then joined the Antwerp school, before entering the service of the Spanish archdukes. Mastering the art of depicting horses and landscapes, his renown crossed borders and in 1662, he was called to Paris by Charles Le Brun, first painter to King Louis XIV and director of the
