



Amusing Cane Dating From The Late 19th Century

Description

Rare gadget cane known as the "Amusing reluctant beheaded" that slices the throat of the head mounted on a cut-out wheel system. The blade slides over the edges of the wheel, which hooks onto the top part. The mother-of-pearl-handled knife is found inside at the bottom of the cane. Patented in 1898, this cane took the name "Décapité récalcitrant" and was sold at Renaut et Cie in Paris. Note: Similar cane illustrated in Catherine Dike's book "Les cannes à systèmes" chapter 15/28 page 148 (see below). Dimension: length 91 cm. Paris datable circa 1898.
