Jacques (1926-2008) and Dani Ruelland (1933-2010) Jacques Ruelland graduated from the Ecole des Beaux Arts in Paris in the late 40s. In 1950, he and his wife Danielle made a stopover in Vallauris, which confirmed their desire to work in ceramics. They began their profession by improvising as ceramists in a Versailles cellar. They then moved to a workshop

on rue de Buci. The Ruelland couple trained in ceramics, Ruelland worked in terracotta, drawing inspiration from other arts such as painting and theater. Between the 50s to the end of the 70s, Jacques and Danielle created a number of ceramic models, pitchers, bowls, goblets and vases, with him creating the decor for the shapes she imagines. Their creations many bright colors: yellow, orange, ocean blue, coral red coral red, bright green and black. In 1970, the couple moved to the south of France, to the commune of Les Angles Paris for good, but this didn't stop them from experimenting with new ceramic processes and spreading the word about this material.
