Description

This rare and elegant set consists of four harmoniously curved Art Nouveau coat hooks, signed Adolf Loos and manufactured in Vienna around 1910. These coat hooks embody the architect's rejection of superfluous ornamentation in favor of pure, functional beauty. Designed around 1916 by Adolf Loos (1870-1933) for Café Capua, a Jugendstil establishment in Vienna, each coat hook is made of nickel-plated brass. Its slightly curved double-armed shape combines functionality with sculptural clarity. The purity of the lines, the balance of the proportions and the subtlety of the details testify to the transition between late Secession decoration and the sober, rational elegance advocated by Loos. Their warm, antique patina reinforces the authenticity and historic character of this ensemble. Originally

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dedicated to Café Capua and refined Viennese interiors, this ensemble is a real gem. Whether in private apartments, offices or boutiques, these hooks remain highly functional, yet are precious examples of early twentieth-century design. Used together or separately, they bring a touch of Wiener Moderne sophistication to any contemporary interior.
