Elchinger (1911 - 1975) took over the business in 1934. He creates ceramic collections appreciated by an international clientele. He developed to become Europe's leading manufacturer. Following in the footsteps of Chambost, Ruelland, Jouve and Capron, Fernand Elchinger was one of the great ceramists of the mid-20th century. From 1975 to the present day, the Elchinger dynasty is represented by Marc and then Thibaut Elchinger. The production is firmly focused on high-end tableware and home décor. Internationally renowned designers create colorful and trendy ranges, always on trend. However, the factory closed its doors for good in 2016 after more than 200 years of existence and eight generations. However, the brand name Céramiques Elchinger is still used for its licensed productions and the brand name Elchinger Couturier for its contemporary collections.
