Description

An English Derby porcelain figure of a seated bagpiper with dog, model 301, size 3, dating to the 1760s. The figure is set on a pierced rococo base with low bocage.

Model 301 belongs to the Derby seated musician group and is defined as a reissue of model 280 without candle-holder, with related variants including model 307.

The underside bears the incised number "301" and size "3". The mark corresponds to the early Derby period of circa 1750-1755.

The bagpipe is rendered in a simplified form with a straight terminal instead of the usual flared end, reflecting a reduced and more economical treatment in production and not damage.

A compact and clearly attributable example of early Derby porcelain.
