Description

Pierre-Louis Dagoty (1771 - 1840): A hard-paste porcelain cup and saucer with wide, flared sides and an everted rim, with a C-scroll handle with bracket, raised on a circular foot. Circa 1810, the cup is decorated with a beautifully painted 360-degree panoramic landscape, with a band of gilded harebells on the inside below the rim, gilded rim, foot, and handle. The saucer is also decorated with a landscape and a matching band of gilded harebells, with a gilded rim, and an unglazed base. Maker's marks: Both unmarked. The shape (see references, below) and artistry leave no doubt that this is from the Dagoty factory, Paris. condition is excellent, with no cracks, chips or scratches. The cup has a small, circular, ungilded patch on the front of the handle. No other issues found. The saucer has light gilding wear at the rim and a small amount of wear to the foreground of the landscape. No other issues found. Both have been examined under ultraviolet light and no restoration was found.
