Jean Carlus 1852-1930 Bouldogue francais platre original signed on the terrace patine gomme laque de moulage Jean Carlus is not known for his animal sculpture probably a commission, but the attitude of the bulldog is particularly well executed and has nothing to envy the great animal sculptors of the period. sculptors of the period Jean Marius Siméon Carlus is French sculptor French sculptor, born March 21, 1852 in Lavaur and died June 15, 1930 in Saint-Mandé. Student of Alexandre Falguière and Antonin Mercié at École des beaux-arts de Paris, Jean Carlus is notably the author of the Monument à Buffon du jardin des Plantes de Paris, whose plaster model is preserved in Montbardat museum. he exhibited in 1880, he became a member of the Société des artistes Français in 1886 and exhibited there without competition. He received awards for his works in 1886 (3rd class medal) and 1899 (1st class medal). In 1889, he won a bronze medal at the Exposition Universelle and a silver medal at the Exposition Universelle in 1900 for his Monument aux Instituteurs. He was named Chevalier de la Légion d'honneur in 1920.
