Description: Magnificent pair of finely chased and gilded bronze andirons in the Louis XVI style, dating from the Napoleon III period (circa 1860). Provenance: Château Private Collection. Architecture and Decoration Each piece adopts a neoclassical terminal structure, topped by an elegant antique-style covered pot. The lid is adorned with a flower bud, laurel wreath and acanthus leaves. The body of the vase is adorned with large drooping sprays of oak leaves and acorns, all resting on a pedestal. The base, richly embossed with numerous projections, is decorated with canals and an interlaced molding punctuated with buttons. At its center, a rosette with swirling acanthus leaves
