Westerwald, Germany, at the Reinhold Hanke factory founded in 1868. Hanke, a prominent ceramist and businessman, played a key role in the revival of glazed stoneware from the XV-XVI century. In 1875, he was appointed official supplier to the Royal Court of Prussia. The factory was closed in 1938.
