Austria 18th century, around Balthasar Ferdinand MOLL 1717-1785, Charles V as Roman Emperor, bronze with brown and gold patina, presented on a wooden column base painted in imitation of marble. The most famous most famous effigies of Charles V (1500-1558), emperor of the Holy German Empire, are those created by the Italian sculptor and Leone Leoni (1509-1590), either in profile on medals or as bronze or in the form of a half-body bronze statue, such as the one in the Prado Museum (inv. no. E000271). This small bronze bust presented here is distinguished by its finely chiselled chasing. It may be of Austrian origin, most likely to the sculptor Balthasar Ferdinand Moll. Balthasar Ferdinand Moll (1717-1785), a pupil of the famous Georg Raphael Donner, who worked at
