Description

Jacques Gautier, known as Tal'houarn (1902-1995), was a Breton painter associated with the École de Paris, whose work blends poetic figuration with Fauvist and Expressionist influences. He adopted the pseudonym Tal'houarn, meaning "iron" in Breton. Although the details of his artistic training are poorly documented, his style suggests an influence of twentieth-century modernist movements. Tal'houarn is renowned for his portraits, nudes, landscapes, seascapes, genre scenes and abstract compositions. His style, described as "poetic reality", features a vivid palette and expressive compositions, often inspired by Breton folklore. He liked to dress his models in garb that evoked history or folklore, particularly of Brittany. "Portraits de
