Description

Elegant ball-shaped vase on a small flattened ring foot, in blown multi-layered glass, made by the Schneider factory in its "Le Verre Français" commercial line. The globular body flares out into a small neck with a hemmed, upturned lip, in a beautiful golden honey hue that contrasts with the dark palette of the body. The decoration, obtained with a double layer of orange and garnet-brown glass on an amber-yellow background, was freed with hydrofluoric acid using the factory's characteristic technique: a continuous composition of sinuous branches bearing stylized bunches and foliage unfolds around the entire circumference, the deep burgundy-red and orange tones creating a luminous vibration typical of Épinay-sur-Seine production in the 1920s.
