In the course of his professional career, he achieved several professional goals, both in Italy and abroad, particularly in the field of shopping center architecture. He also devoted himself to interior design, graphic design and visual communication, and was a member of the AGI (New York

Institute of Graphic Arts). He worked for major companies such as Bayer, Bernini, Montecatini, Monteschell, Zucchi, Cinzano, Alessi, Cassina, Parmalat and Feltrinelli. In 1962, he was awarded the La Palma d'Oro prize for advertising and the Rizzoli prize in 1966. He taught for several years at the Academy of Fine Arts in Carrara and at the Gesamthochschule in Essen. His success in furniture is marked by refined woodwork and a touch of modernity brought to tradition. Silvio Coppola has designed iconic furniture for Montina, Bernini, Cassina and Artemide. In 1967, he founded an exhibition design group with Munari and Grignani, to research design applied to trade shows, fairs and museums. He died in his beloved Milan in 1985.
