genre of Scottish Highland landscape with
animals. He exhibited at the Royal Academy, the
Royal Society of Artists, and the Royal Scottish
Academy, and his works are held in several
British public collections, including the National
Collection, the Atkinson Art Gallery, and the
Oldham Gallery. The painting depicts a group of
sheep -- a standing ram and two ewes at rest with
a lamb -- on a grassy hillside overlooking a
