Description

Exceptional Dutch cabinet dating from around 1800, a remarkable testament to European craftsmanship of the early 19th century. This high-quality piece of furniture, with two doors and three drawers, is made from thuya oak, a precious species particularly sought after in European cabinetmaking for the richness of its veining and the depth of its warm shades. Its imposing architecture is distinguished by a flowing front with curved projection, refined sculpted decoration and beautiful gilded bronze fittings, handles and keyways, recalling the influences of Dutch Baroque and early Rococo forms still present in interiors of this period. The upper part opens onto a vast storage space, ideal for linen, precious crockery or a collection, while the three lower drawers provide additional

functionality while maintaining the majestic balance of the whole. The warm patina of the wood, beautifully preserved, highlights the deep, tormented patterns of the cedar burl, giving this piece of furniture an exceptional presence.
