Superb egg-shaped ewer of ovoid form resting on a pedestal finely chased with water leaves. The body, with this highlighted by an elegant frieze of antique-inspired palmettes. The handle is decorated and is formed by a finely sculpted swan's head, whose beak forms the start of the pourer, and terminates in an applique woman's head, an emblematic motif of the Empire style. The Empire style, here treated with great finesse. A piece of pure, balanced lines, perfectly illustrating the refinement of French silverware of the early 19th century.
