The historyof glazed earthenware during the French Renaissance is marked by the personalitySaintonge potter Bernard Palissy (1510?-1590), around whom a myriadaround whom a myth has been woven. In addition to his considerable scientific contributionartist and writer associated his name with the creation of

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"rusticfigulines", for which he received the official title of "Inventordes figulines du Roy". This decoration, known as "rustiques figulines" is essentially made up of animals (fish, lizards, frogs,crayfish), shells and plants in high relief. Fauna and floraseem to come alive on a rocky surface. The extreme precision of anatomicalanatomical details and vigorous naturalism are the fruit of a mastery of theof direct casting and overmolding, as well as a mastery of thethe science of jaspered glazes.
