



Solid Silver Perfume Burner

Solid silver perfume burner resting on a four-lobed pedestal decorated with foliate scrolls and shells, beneath a collar of oves with fleurs-de-lis. The flared bowl features sarabesques and stylized fleurs-de-lis. It is flanked by removable fluted grips. The crown-shaped upper part is supported by a delicately openwork gallery. The handle is crowned with a discreet cross. This densely-packed piece of goldsmithing is distinguished by its fine chasing on an amati background. Probably commissioned probably a private commission for a chapel. Minerve hallmark 950/1000 on piedouche, cup and crown edge. Goldsmith's hallmark on lid and bowlcup (2), difficult to identify.
