### Description

This mask represents the head of the bodhisattva Maitreya (Japanese: Miroku Bosatsu). The original on which this mask is based is a famous wooden sculpture from the 7th century (Asuka period), preserved at the Chugu-ji temple in Nara. The mask is covered in plaster, gilding and colorful polychromy; its heart is made of wood or plaster, which is difficult to determine. Japan, 19th - 20th century. Translation of the inscription:??? (Mo Kokuho): Replica of a National Treasure.??? (Chugu-ji): Chugu-ji.???? temple (Shisui Bosatsu): Bodhisattva in meditation. Dimensions: 25 x 16.5 x 10 cm.
